C. Article XXI, Section II. Dolote the phrases, "during a regular sestion," and "the remainder of the school year." Substitute for the latter, "for one year." Then add:

Exception i. A pupil who has attended a Junior High School may, upon completion of all grades offered by that school, become eligible at ence to participate in the activities of the organization upon transferring to a Senior High School in his district. A student may transfer upon the completion of the eight grade to any high school in his district and be eligible immediately.

Exception II. A pupil whose parents move from one school district to another may transfer his rights and prillieges to the school district at the time the parents move. The student may remain at the school he is attending and be eligible.

Exception III. A student living in a zone where there is no high school may choose the school be wishes to attend unless the school board designates the school he is to attend.

Exception IV. A student who is a ward of the state (foster child,

etc.) may become oligible immediately.

Exception V. A student who has completed the highest grade (lowest being grade 8) of a non-pupile school may transfer to any school in his city.

D. Additional Section to Article VIII. Duties of State Commissioner of Athletics.

Section 10. The commissioner does not have to wait for a formal presentation of a rule infraction before he takes action. Should he become aware of an infraction he shall have full authority to investigate the case and impose panalty.

### E. Additional Sections for Football Plan

Section 25. All jamborees must be sponsored by a member school and must be approved by the Executive Council. Add sub-division "a" to Section 24 for Football Plan.

Only one all star game in any sport in Louisiana may be hold, and must be sanctioned by the Polican Coaches Association. No athlatic director, coach, principal, teacher or other official of a member school shall assist either directly or indirectly, with the coaching management, direction, selection of players, promotion or officiating of any all-star or similar contest in which one or more of the competing teams is composed of high school player or players, who during the previous school year, were members of a high school team, unless such contest is sanctioned by the L. I. A. L. O., persons who violate this rule shall cause their school to be fined \$200 or suspended from the L. I. A. L. O. for one year. Certified officials shall be suspended one year for officiating in such contest.

Section 26. The first place team in each district shall enter the football playoff. The following rules will apply:

- a. All first place winners must be named by Sunday following the last playing date as listed in the calendar of events.
- b. Districts not playing in the first round bi-district games may, in case of a tie within the district, have an extra week to name their district champions.
- c. District winners in case of a tie, except as above, must be worked out in the respective districts and announced Sunday following the last playing date. When time is available to have a ploy-off, have one.
