Proposed Amendments to the Constitution as submitted through May 5, 1967:

I. Proposed amendments submitted by Mr. Willie Daniels, Southern Regional commissioner of Athletics, April 25, 1967.

A. Additional Sections to Article XX, Classification of Schools.

Section 8. Any school wishing to move voluntarily into a higher classification must participate in at least two major sports (football, basketball, baseball or track).

Section 9. Class A schools may play football in Class AA division without affecting their classification for other sports and literary activities.

B. Additional Sections to Article XXI, Eligibility

Section 14. All eligibility rules are waived in the case of State School for Deaf.

Section 15. Eligibility lists in football must be exchanged between schools and signed by the coaches.

C. Article XXI, Section II. Delete the phrases, "during a regular session," and "the remainder of the school year." Substitute for the latter, "for one year." Then add:

Exception I. A pupil who has attended a Junior High School may, upon completion of all grades offered by that school, become eligible at once to participate in the activities of the organization upon transferring to a Senior High School in his district. A student may transfer upon the completion of the eight grade to any high school in his district and be eligible immediately.

Exception II. A pupil whose parents move from one school district to another may transfer his rights and privileges to the school district at the time the parents move. The student may remain at the school he is attending and be eligible.

Exception III. A student living in a zone where there is no high school may choose the school he wishes to attend unless the school board designates the school he is to attend.

Exception IV. A student who is a ward of the state (foster child,

etc.) may become eligible immediately.

Exception V. A student who has completed the highest grade (lowest being grade 8) of a non-public school may transfer to any school in his city.

D. Additional Section to Article VIII. Duties of State Commissioner of Athletics.

Section 10. The commissioner does not have to wait for a formal presentation of a rule infraction before he takes action. Should he become aware of an infraction he shall have full authority to investigate the case and impose penalty.

E. Additional Sections for Football Plan

Section 25. All jamborees must be sponsored by a member school and must be approved by the Executive Council. Add sub-division "a" to Section 24 for Football Plan.

Only one all star game in any sport in Louisiana may be held, and must be sanctioned by the Pelican Coaches Association. No athletic director, coach, principal, teacher or other official of a member school shall assist either directly or indirectly, with the coaching management, direction, selection of players, promotion or officiating of any all-star or similar contest in which one or more of the competing teams is composed of high school player or players, who during the previous school year, were members of a high school team, unless such contest is sanctioned by the L. I. A. L. O., persons who violate this rule shall cause their school to be fined \$200 or suspended from the L. I. A. L. O. for one year. Certified officials shall be suspended one year for officiating in such contest.

For _____ Against _____

Section 26. The first place team in each district shall enter the football playoff. The following rules will apply:

- a. All first place winners must be named by Sunday following the last playing date as listed in the calendar of events.
- b. Districts not playing in the first round bi-district games may, in case of a tie within the district, have an extra week to name their district champions.
- c. District winners in case of a tie, except as above, must be worked out in the respective districts and announced Sunday following the last playing date. When time is available to have a play-off, have one.

Alternatives for "c" under Section 26.

- 1. That if two teams be tied for first then the one which defeated the other in regular season play be declared to re-

2. That if three teams be tied for first, then if (1) one defeated the other two, then it shall be first. Two (2) defeated the other one, then of these two whichever defeated the other in regular season play shall be first. If still tied, refer to District Executive Committee.
3. If four teams be tied for first then of the two which have the best record against those with whom they are tied--the other in regular season play shall be first.

II. Proposed Amendments submitted by Mr. Wilbert Brown and Rev. Robert Grant, S. S. S., Principals of District V, AAA, Joseph S. Clark High School and St. Augustine High School respectively: Submitted April 25, 1967.

- A. Junior Varsity or "B" Teams can play only other Junior Varsity or "B" Teams in any sport. They are not permitted to play Varsity Teams from either "A" - "AA" or "AAA."

- B. Junior Varsity or "B" Teams in any sport must turn in rosters - regular type L. I. A. O. rosters - and those rosters must fulfill all the demands of Varsity L. I. A. L. O. rosters.

- C. Junior Varsity Athletes can move up and down between the Varsity and Junior Varsity - provided they obey the five day rule of the present L. I. A. L. O. Constitution.

In football they can also move up and down - Varsity and Junior Varsity - provided they obey the five day rule of the present L. I. A. L. O. Constitution.

- D. A paid full-time athletic and literary commissioner should be appointed with an appropriate staff.

III. Proposed Amendments submitted by Rev. Robert H. Grant, S. S. J., Principal of St. Augustine High School, April 25, 1967:

- A. Each District in the L. I. A. L. O. should have one representative on the Executive Committee. These representatives along with the elected officers shall constitute the Executive Committee.

- B. The Annual Meeting of the L. I. A. L. O. (May) shall be held alternately in the north region and the south region in consecutive years.

- IV. Proposed Amendment submitted by Rev. Robert H. Grant, S. S. J., Principal of St. Augustine High School, May 2, 1967:

"It is permissible to select as a duly authorized officer of any district any staff member of an approved college, public or private, in the State of Louisiana."

For _____ Against _____

- V. Proposed Amendments submitted by Dr. Alvin J. Aubry, Principal, L. B. Landry Junior-Senior High School, May 4, 1967.

A. That non-public schools or non-public schools which are members of the L. I. A. L. O. not be permitted to have as athletic participants students who have enrolled but whose parents reside outside the State of Louisiana or the parish of the said school.

B. That non-public school athletes who may reside in any area of the parish may participate in athletic activities.

For _____ Against _____

C. That public school athletic participants from elementary, junior high schools or senior high schools will not be permitted to participate in any athletic activity of a non-public school until after one academic year of enrollment in the non-public school.

For _____ Against _____

D. That non-public school athletic participants from elementary, junior high or senior high schools will not be permitted scholarships of free tuition, free meals or part of thereof in any non-public school under penalty of \$500.00 fine or one (1) year suspension or both.

For _____ Against _____

E. That non-public school athletic participants from elementary, junior high schools or senior high schools will not be permitted to participate in any athletic activity of a public school until after one academic year of enrollment in the public school.
